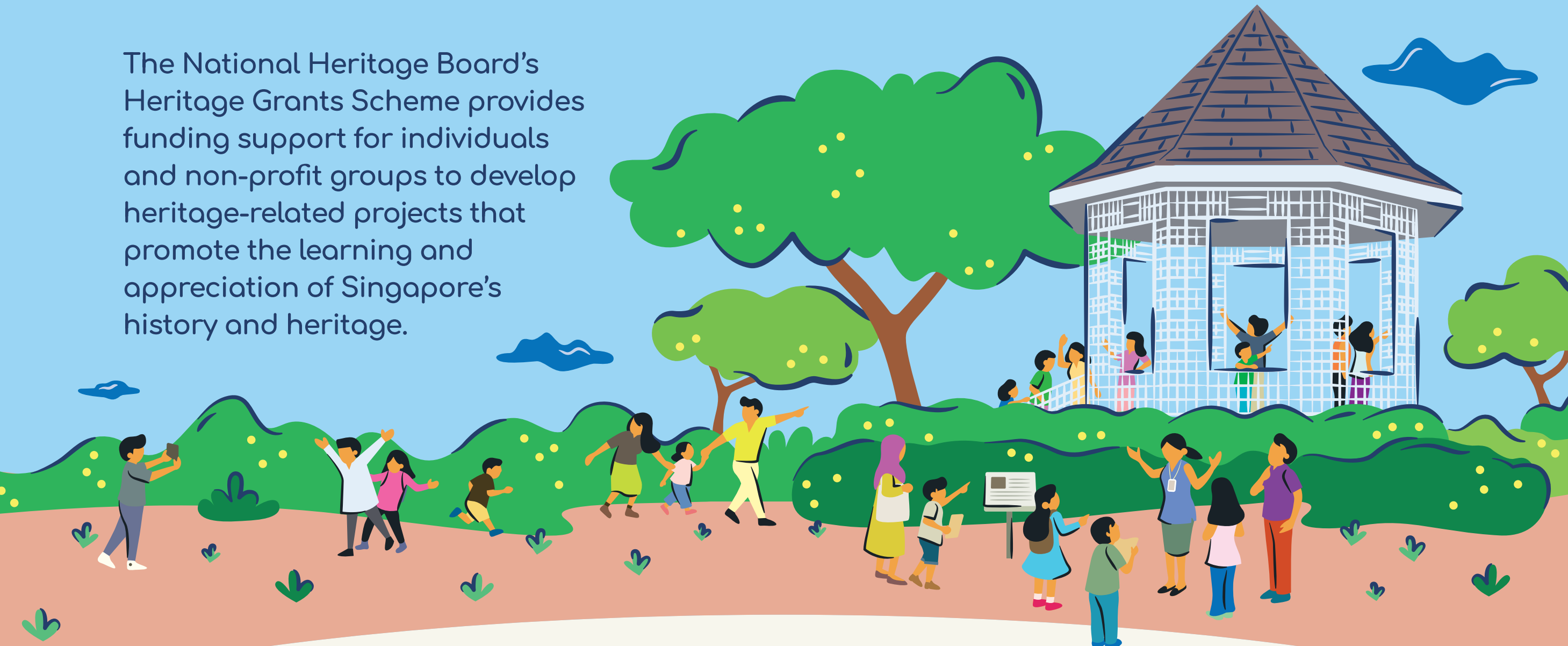


# HERITAGE GRANTS SCHEME

The National Heritage Board's Heritage Grants Scheme provides funding support for individuals and non-profit groups to develop heritage-related projects that promote the learning and appreciation of Singapore's history and heritage.

<b>FUNDING SUPPORT</b> 	Capped at <b>S\$50,000</b> or <u>up to 50%</u> of total qualifying project cost, whichever is lower	Capped at <b>S\$150,000</b> or <u>up to 50%</u> of total qualifying project cost, whichever is lower
<b>SUITABLE FOR</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>First-timers, with little/no experience in heritage projects</li> <li>Starter projects</li> <li>Projects on recurring heritage themes</li> <li>School Heritage Corners/Galleries</li> <li>Project costs typically below S\$100,000</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Experienced in developing heritage projects</li> <li>With good track record in grant projects</li> <li>Impactful projects that address a research gap</li> <li>Projects on lesser known heritage themes, ethnic communities, traditions or trades</li> <li>Project costs typically S\$100,001 and above</li> </ul>
<b>ELIGIBILITY</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Singapore Citizen/PR who is 18 years old and above, and residing in Singapore.</li> <li>Non-profit organisations, locally-registered interest groups and clans/associations.</li> <li>Non-profit educational institutions and educational institutions under the purview of MOE.</li> <li>Informal groups with a nominated individual or local legally constituted organisation (to take legal and financial responsibility for the grant).</li> <li>Individuals who are applying for the <u>Major Project Grant</u> must apply with a co-applicant; and, projects must have a confirmed partnership with a registered society.</li> </ul> <p>Not eligible<sup>1</sup>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local/Foreign public institutions which receive operational funding from government agencies.</li> <li>Existing Heritage Grants recipients, or recipients with outstanding grant repayments.</li> <li>Those involved in other ongoing NHB grant projects.</li> </ul>
