# 04 SAM Receives \$66 Million of Artworks – the Largest in NHB's History!

2 September 2008 was a significant milestone in the National Heritage Board's (NHB) history as it marked the largest donation of artworks made to a Singapore museum. NHB and the Singapore Art Museum (SAM) were the honoured recipients of 113 exquisite paintings – valued at a whopping S\$66 million – by internationally renowned Chinese artist Wu Guanzhong.

Sealing the agreement was a signing ceremony held in Beijing on 2 September between Wu Guanzhong and Mr Kwok Kian Chow, Director of SAM. The Chair of SAM, Ms Jane Ittogi, the Chairman of the National Art Gallery Executive Committee, Mr Koh Seow Chuan, as well as the artist's family were present at the ceremony. Wu Guanzhong's generous gift to SAM follows a similar donation of 66 works made to the Shanghai Art Museum earlier this year.

Born on 29 August 1919 in Yixing, Jiangsu Province, China, Wu Guanzhong is a leading Chinese painter, art educator and essayist of the 20th century. Lauded for his ability to fuse traditional Chinese art with western forms, Wu Guanzhong will be presenting some of his best known pieces such as *Hometown Morning* (1960), *Pandas* (1992) and *Grass, oh, Grass* (1999) in an exhibition scheduled at SAM in 2009. The exhibition is a partnership between the Shanghai Art Museum and SAM.

NHB thanks Wu Guanzhong for entrusting his lifetime of masterpieces to SAM and commits to sharing them with the public through more exhibitions and shows.

## Singapore Aces Regional Art Prize

**Title:** APB Foundation Signature Art Prize Exhibition  
**Date:** 10 Oct - 16 Nov 2008  
**Venue:** Singapore Art Museum

Singapore emerged tops in the inaugural Asia Pacific Breweries (APB) Foundation Signature Art Prize with local artist Yeo Chee Kiong bagging the Grand Prize of S\$45,000 – the single largest art prize in Southeast Asia. Organised by the APB Foundation and Singapore Art Museum (SAM), the prize is awarded triennially to artists whose works represent a significant development in contemporary art.

Yeo Chee Kiong's winning masterpiece, *A Day Without A Tree*, is a mixed media installation illustrating the devastating effects of global warming through the illusion of melting columns at the National Museum of Singapore's Rotunda. Yeo Chee Kiong's work was selected from the outstanding artworks of 10 finalists short-listed from 34 nominated entries. The nine other finalists hail from Cambodia, China, India, Malaysia, Mongolia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam.

Four other artists also bagged honours for their creativity and ingenuity. The three Juror's Choice Awards, at S\$10,000 each, went to Malaysian artist Mr Ahmad Fuad B. Osman for *Recollections of Long Lost Memories*, Chinese artist Mr Zheng Bo for *Karibu Islands*, and Indian artist Mr G.R. Iranna for *Wounded Tools*. The S\$10,000 People's Choice Award – the only award determined by public votes – was awarded to Mongolian artist Mr Davaa Dorjderem for *Voice in the Space*.

The awards were presented on 14 October 2008 to the winning artists by Mr Raymond Lim, Minister for Transport and Second Minister for Foreign Affairs, at a gala dinner at the Raffles Hotel. Don't miss the chance to catch a glimpse of all 10 short-listed artworks at SAM from now till 16 November!

## Home is Where the Heart is

**Title:** HEARTLANDS: Home and Nation in the Art of Ong Kim Seng

Witness the evolution of Singapore's heartlands with a heartwarming exhibition of 35 paintings by renowned local artist and Cultural Medallion recipient Ong Kim Seng. Co-organised by the Singapore Art Museum (SAM) and National Arts Council, and supported by the Housing and Development Board (HDB) and Standard Chartered Bank, *HEARTLANDS: Home and Nation in the Art of Ong Kim Seng* celebrates our public housing estates housing the majority of Singaporeans.

Divided into the pre-HDB and post-HDB eras, *HEARTLANDS* begins with a walk down memory lane. 23 small works of the rural heartlands in the 1960s and 1970s depict places around Ong Kim Seng's neighbourhood in his youth, especially the Bukit Merah area where he grew up. Displayed alongside these paintings are contemporary photographs of the same places, exhibited to illustrate the changes over the years. The second group of 12 large works boldly juxtapose scenes drawn from reality with historical images. In one painting, HDB blocks in Beo Crescent are depicted alongside firemen putting out a fire, in reference to the famous Bukit Ho Swee fire of 1961.

A companion book with poems written by Ong Kim Seng's friend of over 20 years, Koh Buck Song, will be introduced at the exhibition. Also featured will be a video presentation of places in Singapore's heartlands, both past and present, by Ong Kim Seng's cinematographer son, Henry Ong. Significant and meaningful, this exhibition pays tribute to a subject close to the hearts of many Singaporeans.

# 06 Superhero Fever at SPM!

**Title:** Comics and Superheroes

Explore the world of make-believe where Boy Scout hero Tintin meets caveman Alley Oop, and superheroes defeat evil with their extraordinary powers. This exhibition of comic-inspired stamps at the Singapore Philatelic Museum (SPM) explores the origins of comics dating back to the 17th century.



Catch your favourite comic characters like Superman and Tintin at SPM!

It all began with the introduction of caricature in the mid 1600s, and the development of this illustrious style of expression over the years. Unknown to many, these graphic sketches were also used as a tool to ridicule the royalty and aristocracy, and man's follies. They eventually evolved into the comic strips and books we know so well today.

Few would also know that one of the first comic strips in America was *The Yellow Kid* created by Richard Felton Outcault in 1895. It paved the way for other famous American strips such as *The Phantom* in 1936, and *Superman* amidst the gloom of World War II. In fact, the proliferation of comics during the 1940s crowned it the 'Golden Age of Comics'.

With their vibrant pictures and catchy phrases, comics never fail to amuse and entertain. And what better way to make them a part of our daily lives than through stamps? Visit the SPM and admire vibrant stamps depicting favourite comic and cartoon characters like Batman, Pokemon, Dick Tracy and timeless Disney favourites, and unravel the interesting stories they have to tell.

Engaging with ideas and works stemming from the Bauhaus, concrete and constructivist art, as well as minimalism in Europe and America, the show features international contemporary photography, video and object art. Car enthusiasts will also enjoy a special segment featuring car-related art from Andy Warhol and other artists. Art education is a strong focus of the show and a dedicated workbook will be specially produced for children and youths to discover more about art.

The exhibition's title – *is it tomorrow yet?* – reflects the hopes and aspirations behind many of the modern art movements of the 20th century. Despite the differences in styles and forms, they often share a certain optimism about the future, a hope that tomorrow will herald better things.
