### **MEET GARUDA**

Garuda is often shown as a half-human and half-bird figure. Many stories are told of the Garuda fighting the Naga – the king of the serpents.

Many Hindu gods and goddesses have a "vehicle", a creature that helps them move around and perform their duties. We can read about Garuda's adventures with Vishnu, an important Hindu god, in many stories.

#### GARUDA

Tibet, 15th century Copper alloy

Garuda carries the Hindu god Vishnu on his travels. Creatures that accompany gods and goddesses are called their "vehicle" or "mount".

Buddhist art from Tibet and Nepal is known as Himalayan art because the mountain range of that same name is found in this area. The Garuda can be seen in many of the artworks here because local people see him as a guardian or protector.

In this sculpture, his outstretched arms would have held a snake.


