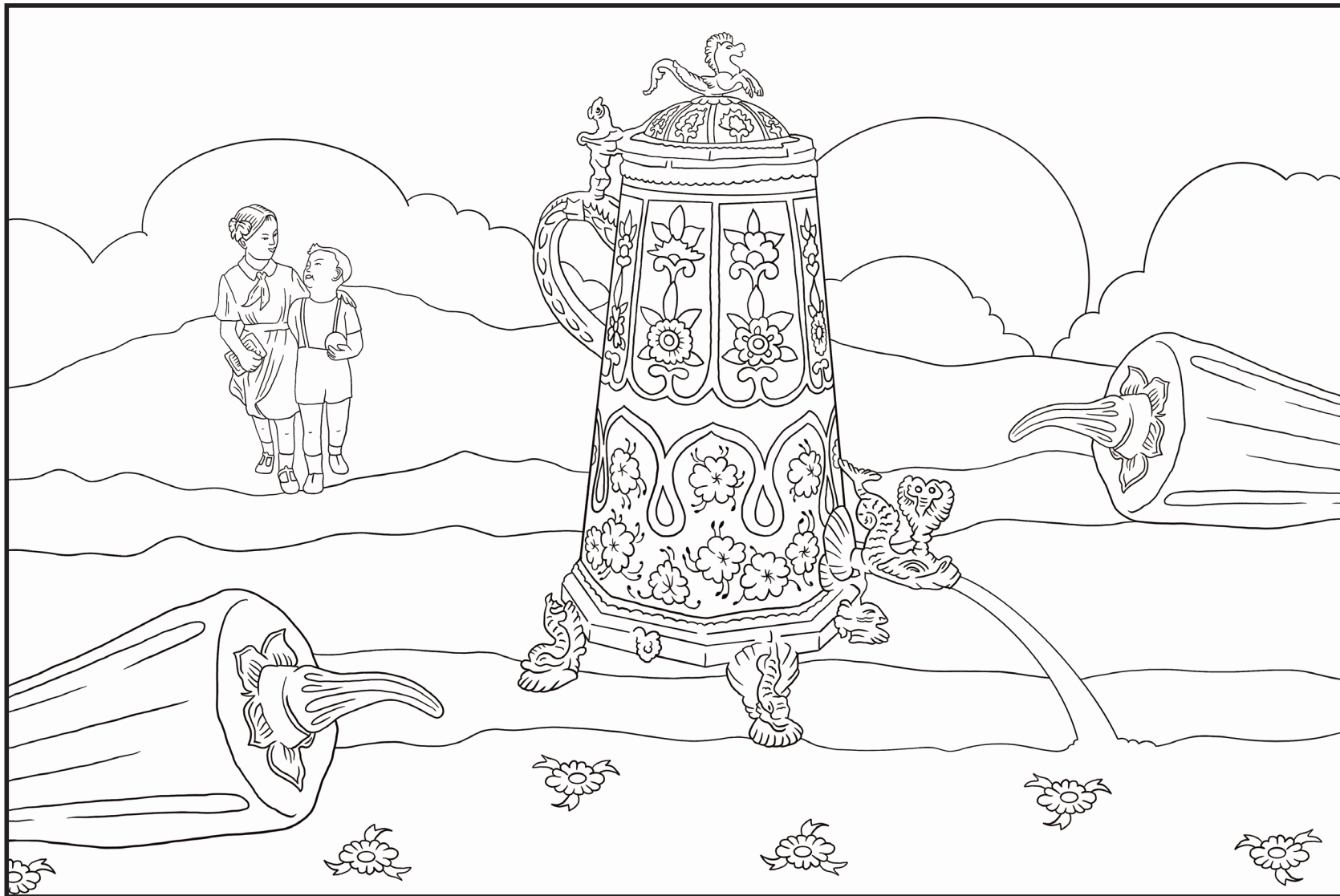

### Coffee pot

Porcelain pot made in Japan, in the late 1600s or early 1700s; gilded metal mounts added in Germany, in the 1700s.

Coffee became popular in Europe around the mid-1600s. Coffee pots like this Japanese porcelain one were ordered from overseas via the European trading companies of the time. What's your preference, coffee or tea?



### Chilli pepper-shaped snuff bottle

Made in China in the 18th or 19th century from porcelain. This object was a gift from Doris and Franklin Chow in honour of Dr Kenson Kwok, Founding Director of ACM

A popular ingredient in many Asian recipes, the humble chilli likely originated from the Americas and was first brought to Asia by Portuguese traders.



### Two Chinese children

Made in China in the 1960s or 1970s from porcelain. This object was a gift from Mr Xu Cheng Bin
