

HERITAGE GRANTS SCHEME

The National Heritage Board's Heritage Grants Scheme provides co-funding support for interested individuals and non-profit groups seeking to develop ground-up and community-initiated heritage projects that promote the learning and appreciation of Singapore's history and heritage.



ABOUT THE GRANT

FUNDING SUPPORT



Supports up to 80% of total qualifying costs, or up to net deficit, whichever is lower.

Maximum funding is
\$50,000

MAJOR PROJECT GRANT

Supports up to 80% of total qualifying costs, or up to net deficit, whichever is lower.

Maximum funding is
\$150,000

SUITABLE FOR



- First-time applicants, with little/no experience in developing heritage projects
 - Starter projects
 - Projects on recurring heritage themes
 - School Heritage Corners/Galleries
 - Small-scale projects involving basic research methodologies
- Experienced in developing heritage projects
 - Impactful projects that address a research gap
 - Projects on lesser-known heritage themes, communities, traditions, or trades
 - Large-scale projects involving robust qualitative research methodologies

ELIGIBILITY



- Singaporean Citizen/PR who is 18 years old and above, and residing in Singapore.
- Locally registered non-profit organisations, interest groups and clans/associations.
- Schools under the purview of MOE.
- Informal groups with a nominated individual or a local legally constituted organisation (to take legal and financial responsibility for the grant).
- Individuals applying for the Major Project Grant must apply with a co-applicant; and projects must have a confirmed partnership with a registered non-profit organisation/society.

Not eligible:

- Local/Foreign public institutions that are receiving operational funding from government agencies.
- Existing Heritage Grant recipients, or recipients with outstanding grant repayments.

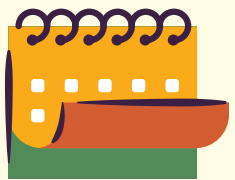
COMMON PROJECT TYPES¹

PROJECT DURATION



Projects must be completed within 24 months from the grant award start date, or within the approved Project Schedule in the Letter of Award.

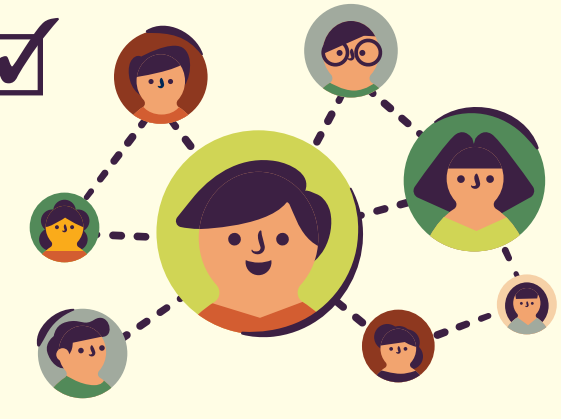

OUTREACH

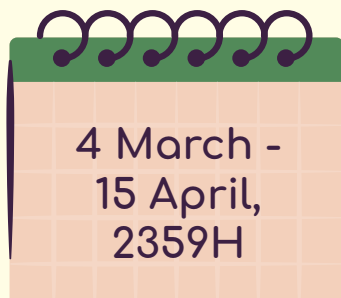
Extent of local community engagement and publicity plans

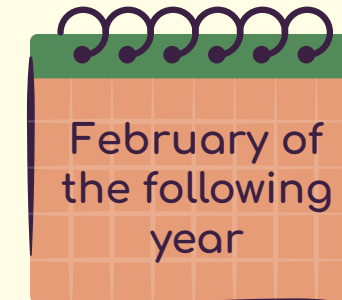
Application Window
