



## CHILDREN'S MUSEUM SINGAPORE LAUNCHES "LKY100 – THE BOY WHO BECAME PRIME MINISTER" EXHIBITION

Young visitors will discover a different side of Singapore's founding Prime Minister's story through murals, artefacts and programmes.

Singapore, 18 August 2023 –What were founding Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew's growing up years like, and what did he have to overcome in order to become a man who helped build Singapore into a thriving cosmopolitan city? In commemoration of the 100th anniversary of Mr Lee's birth, Children's Museum Singapore (CMSG) has launched its latest exhibition – *LKY100* – *The Boy Who Became Prime Minister* – which traces the late Mr Lee's story from his childhood to his career as a statesman, and examines the values he espoused and the legacy he left behind. The exhibition runs from 19 August 2023 to 14 January 2024.

Start with Wonder





- The exhibition seeks to deepen young visitors' understanding of the Singapore story through the lens of Mr Lee's life and values, and foster a sense of pride at how far we have come. Along with his better-known achievements, visitors will also discover a more relatable side of Mr Lee, who grew up in the 1920s playing with *gasing*, marbles and fighting fish. In doing so, the exhibition also aims to show that young people can have big dreams and can make a difference in their communities and nation.
- Mrs Wai Yin Pryke, Museum Director, CMSG, said: "We hope the exhibition will reveal a more relatable side to Mr Lee Kuan Yew as a young boy growing up to our children, and in the process inspire them by showing how he went on to achieve extraordinary things. We hope they will be encouraged to dream big and 'follow that rainbow', as Mr Lee famously once said."

#### Capturing the legacy of Mr Lee Kuan Yew for the next generation

- As part of the exhibition's curatorial process, CMSG organised focus group discussions with our community of Little Ambassadors which comprise children of different age groups and their parents. The purpose of these discussions was to gather their views about Mr Lee Kuan Yew and what they would like to learn about him, and resulted in the exhibition focusing on exploring Mr Lee's childhood, and expounding on his values and legacy in a light, easily-digestible way.
- The exhibition is located in CMSG's Discovery Room. It welcomes visitors with the *Cabinet of Curiosity*, where an array of artefacts tell stories of different periods in Mr Lee's life. These include a Telok Kurau East School (now Telok Kurau Primary School) admission register bearing his English name "Lee Harry", from when he studied there from 1930 to 1935. A tennis racket presented to Mr Lee in 1973 will also show his penchant for leading a healthy lifestyle, demonstrated by his active participation in sports such as tennis, cricket and swimming during his schooling years. - Young visitors can also enjoy mural walls which juxtapose milestones in Mr Lee's life and career against Singapore's development, and also contemplate and pose with some of Mr Lee's famous sayings in a "quotes mirror".
- 7 To complement *LKY100 The Boy Who Became Prime Minister*, CMSG will present a series of programmes which include interactive storytelling sessions, hands-on craft workshops, and a unique mystery box challenge. For more details on the programmes, please refer to **Annex B**.
- 8 In addition, an *LKY100 The Boy Who Became Prime Minister* teaser exhibition with accompanying storytelling sessions will travel to selected public libraries across the island from September 2023 to January 2024. The travelling teaser exhibition will also feature artworks submitted by young creators who participated in CMSG's *Singapore Dreaming* competition. The artworks depict the children's hopes and dreams for Singapore in a comic format and selected entries will be printed on Yeo's Soymilk vending machines in their school networks this August. Visitors to CMSG this August will also get a limited-edition packet of Yeo's Heritage Brew

Families with young children can look forward to interactive exhibits, anchored in rich storytelling, complemented by engaging programmes and initiatives. Children will have hands-on opportunities to learn about Singapore's heritage through play.

CMSG organises educational programmes throughout the year to cater to children of different age groups and abilities. These programmes are created in collaboration with educators to ensure that they are developmentally appropriate for children. CMSG is housed in a historical double-storey colonial building that was formerly part of Anglo-Chinese School in 1906. The building housed the Methodist Book Room in the 1970s and 1980s, before being converted to become the Singapore Philatelic Museum in 1995.

## **Tennis Racket presented to Mr Lee Kuan Yew** 1973

Collection of the National Museum of Singapore Donated by President's Office

Mr Lee Kuan Yew was health conscious and led a healthy lifestyle. Even when he was a young boy in school, he used to swim, cycle, and play tennis, and other games. A wooden tennis racket presented to Mr Lee will be on display.



## Mrs Lee Kuan Yew's Barrister Wig

1949

Collection of the National Museum of Singapore

Black robes and white wigs worn in British courtrooms are iconic symbols of the law. On display at the exhibition is Mdm Kwa Geok Choo's barrister wig. Mdm Kwa was a lawyer and the wife of founding Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew and the mother of current Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong.



## Mr Lee Kuan Yew's Pelikan Ballpoint Pen and Fountain Pen

1950s to 2000s

Collection of National Museum of Singapore. Gift of Lee Hsien Loong

As the Prime Minister, Mr Lee Kuan Yew had to write and sign many documents. He once kept this ballpoint pen and fountain pen in the drawer of his office desk.








## Shoe and Shoe moulds from Lee Hoi Wah Shoes

1980s to 1990s Collection of Lee Hoi Wah

Mr Lee was a man of simple tastes, and it showed in the way he dressed. He would order the same pair of formal shoes made of soft black leather from Lee Hoi Wah. The first moulds of Mr Lee's feet are still in the store and are on loan for the exhibition.

#### **OPENING HOURS AND TICKETING INFORMATION**

#### **Opening Hours**

Tuesday - Sunday (closed on Monday)

Timeslots (the museum operates on a timeslot basis):

- 9:00am entry
- 11:00am entry
- 2:00pm entry
- 4:00pm entry

Each visit timeslot is for 1 hour 45 minutes.

The museum is closed between 12:45pm – 2:00pm daily for cleaning.

#### Ticketing

Admission is free for Singapore citizens and permanent residents (pink and blue NRIC).

Admission fees apply for tourists and foreign residents – \$10 per child and \$15 per adult.

Adult visitors are allowed in the museum only when accompanying a child (aged 12 years and below).

To ensure a comfortable visitor experience, advanced online ticket reservations at https://www.nhb.gov.sg/childrensmuseum are required.

All entrance tickets include admission to the Permanent Galleries and the Special Galleries.

The exhibition will be unavailable to visitors when there are programmes held in the room. Exhibition closures will be listed on CMSG's website.
