

- It is guided by the Preservation of Monuments Act to provide "for the preservation and protection of National Monuments".
- It is responsible for identifying monuments that are worthy of preservation, based on the criteria that they are of historic, cultural, traditional, archaeological, architectural, artistic or symbolic significance and national importance.
- There are currently 72 national monuments that have been gazetted in Singapore.

It aims to raise students' awareness of the community and of Singapore's history. It also hopes to develop students' commitment to sharing knowledge on matters relating to heritage.
















Level-Wide (10 people max)

HOW TO ATTAIN THE BADGE?

Criteria:

- All the project requirements are met
- Project must demonstrate learning of heritage and/or culture
- Project must be of an acceptable quality
- Include citations/references for your research**
- Completion of Reflection Form

You can start your project at any time but should complete it ideally within 6 months, or earlier.

**Any plagiarised work will be disqualified

Project Requirements and Formats

- To lead at least 2 guided Heritage Corner/Heritage Trail tours
- Submit a copy of your script with at least 5 areas of interest
- Photo or video documentation of the tour in progress
- At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

Project Requirements and Formats

- Present your research in a creative format and submit via a Microsoft Word document, or upload onto a social media channel (Facebook, Instagram or YouTube). Some presentation formats include, but are not limited to:
 - » Article (to be submitted as a Microsoft Word document). Titles can include: "Did you know?" "My Favourite..." "Top 5 Places..."
 - » Social memories, video documentary or vlog (to be uploaded on YouTube) Approximately 3 mins
 - » Photo diary or scrapbook, (at least 10 images)

For written submissions, (at least 150 words) you should include pictures or interview extracts, wherever possible.

At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

- Document your guided tour on PowerPoint slides (include photos, participants' feedback as well as challenges and how your team solved them)
- At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

Video Submission

- Identify at least 4 sites and conduct an in-depth research on the selected sites
- Create a 2-4 minute video to introduce and provide information on the sites (format not limited to virtual guided tour, documentary, skit etc.), and upload the video onto YouTube
- Document your guided tour on PowerPoint slides (include photos, participants' feedback as well as challenges and how you solved them)
- At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

As a cohort, identify at least 4 sites that best represent your community and design activities/games to be conducted at each site. Do consider the traffic, space, environment and also the possible challenges you may face while playing the games. Also consider the equipment you may need for both the games and possible first-aid scenarios.

Project Requirements and Formats

At the end of the project, you must submit the following:

- Team submission: Word and/or pictorial documentation of how the trail and amazing race was conducted, including a write-up on the selected sites
- Individual submission: share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'
