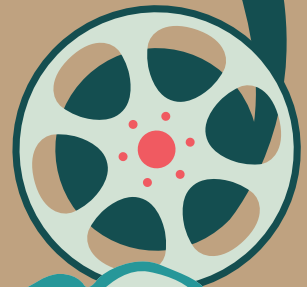

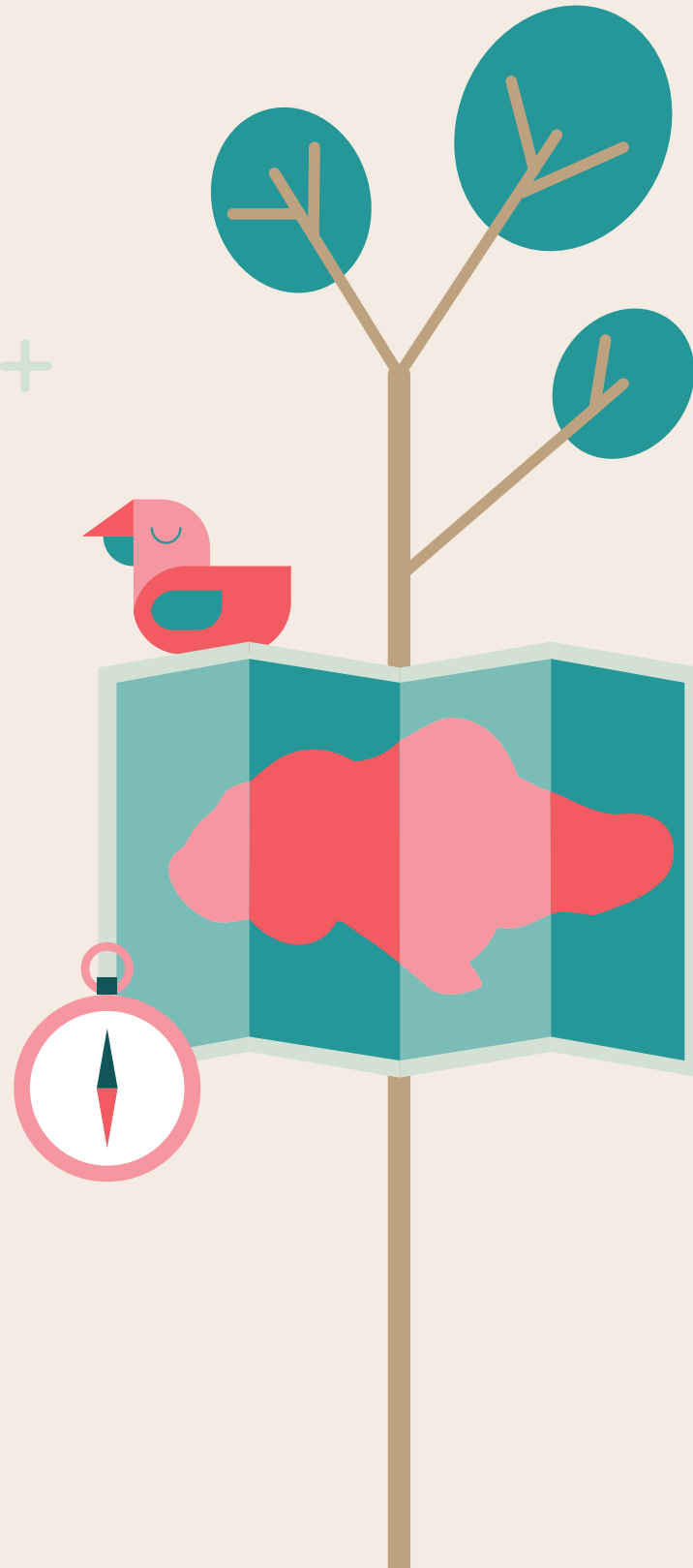

Information Guide

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL HERITAGE BADGE?

The National Heritage Badge is a badge of distinction awarded by the National Heritage Board (NHB) to deserving students who have completed a heritage project specified by the Board.

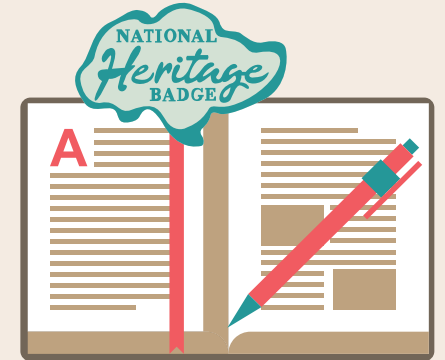
It aims to raise students' awareness of the community and of Singapore's history. It also hopes to develop students' commitment to sharing knowledge on matters relating to heritage.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

It is open to secondary school students from all Uniformed Groups such as Boys' Brigade (BB), Girls' Brigade (GB), Girl Guides (GG), National Cadet Corps (NCC), National Civil Defence Cadet Corps (NCDCC), National Police Cadet Corps (NPCC), Red Cross Youth (RCY), St. John's Brigade (SJB) and Singapore Scout Association (SSA).

WHAT TYPES OF PROJECTS ARE AVAILABLE?

You may choose to embark on either individual, pair-work, group or level-wide projects listed in the booklet and **only one** task needs to be completed. The list of projects is not exhaustive. Please seek permission from your UG teacher in-charge if you plan to change the project requirements.



WHEN DO I HAVE TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT?

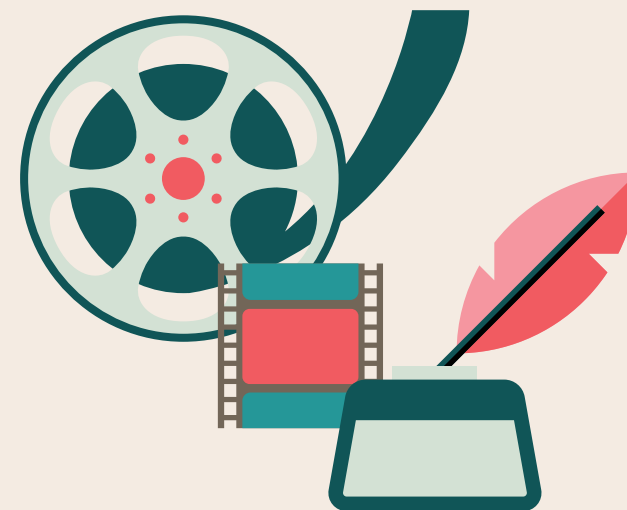
You can start your project at any time but you should complete it ideally within six months, or earlier. You are encouraged to share your projects with your peers during a sharing session.

HOW DO I ATTAIN THE BADGE?

Your respective UG teacher in-charge will verify completion of the project based on the following components: Research, Learning, Creativity, Pride in National Identity and Teamwork (if applicable). Refer to the Project Verification Checklist (Page 14) to ensure you have met the project requirements. You must complete the Reflection Form (Page 15) and submit it at the end of your project.

Choose one of the following tasks:

Task 1

HERITAGE GUIDE

Be a Heritage Superstar Guide and pit your public speaking skills against your teacher's as well as bring your peers on a guided tour! Attempt this challenge and help your peers learn more about heritage. Don't lose your group along the way!

INDIVIDUAL

To begin, choose your tour. This can be based either on your school's Heritage [Corner](#) or Heritage [Trail](#). Next, identify **5 interesting points** to share with your audience. After which, write a script and rehearse! Finally, set a date and invite your peers (or maybe even members of the public) on a guided tour.

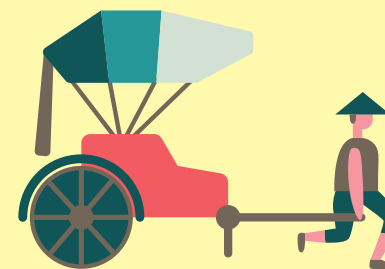

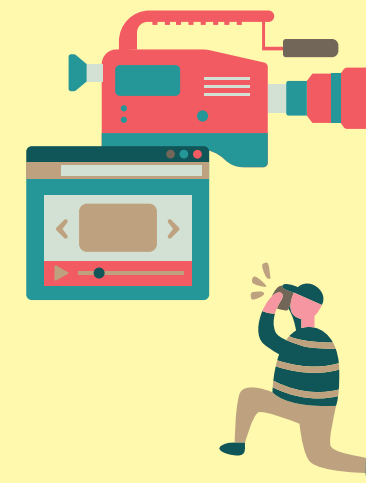

Based on the chosen theme, identify **at least 4 sites of interest** and create a trail using a free mobile app or a video. Set a date and invite your peers (or even members of the public) on a guided group tour!

App Submission

- ☐ Customise your own trail via www.pocket-trips.com or other free trail creation websites/app of your choice
- ☐ Document your guided tour on PowerPoint slides (include photos, participants' feedback as well as challenges and how your team solved them)
- ☐ Identify at least 4 sites and conduct an in-depth research on the selected sites
- ☐ At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

Video Submission

- ☐ Identify at least 4 sites and conduct an in-depth research on the selected sites
- ☐ Document your guided tour on PowerPoint slides (include photos, participants' feedback as well as challenges and how you solved them)
- ☐ Create a 2-4 minute video to introduce and provide information on the sites (format not limited to virtual guided tour, documentary, skit etc.), and upload the video onto YouTube
- ☐ At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

- Remember to select sites that are within walking distance if it is a walking trail.

- Singapore's History

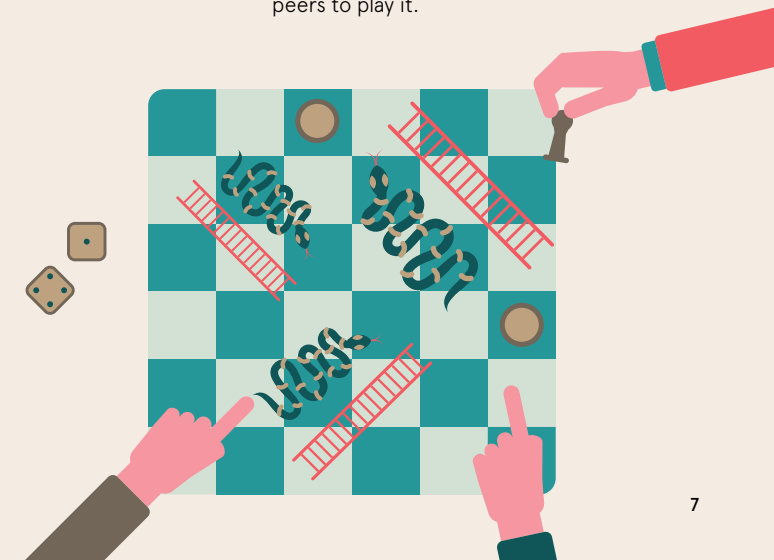


Project Requirements and Formats

- ☐ The Heritage Game could be presented in the format of cards (e.g. Taboo), a board game (e.g. snake and ladder, Monopoly etc.) or online (e.g. website, app)
- ☐ Submit game, photo documentation and comments by participants
- ☐ Create the game and invite your peers to play it. Then, collate their comments and feedback on the game, including areas of improvement
- ☐ At the end of the project, share your thoughts in 'My Reflection'

WHAT IS NATIONAL HERITAGE BOARD AND ITS ROLE?

The National Heritage Board (NHB) was formed on 1 August 1993. As the custodian of Singapore's heritage, NHB is responsible for telling the Singapore story, sharing the Singaporean experience and imparting our Singapore spirit.

NHB's mission is to preserve and celebrate the shared heritage of our diverse communities, for the purpose of education, nation-building and cultural understanding. It manages the national museums and heritage institutions, and sets policies relating to heritage sites, national monuments and the national collection.

Through the national collection, NHB curates heritage programmes and presents exhibitions to connect the past, present and future generations of Singaporeans. NHB is a statutory board under the Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth.

WHAT ARE SINGAPORE'S NATIONAL MONUMENTS?

The Preservation of Sites and Monuments Division (PSM) is the national authority that advises on the preservation of nationally significant monuments in Singapore. It is guided by the Preservation of Monuments Act to provide "for the preservation and protection of National Monuments". It is responsible for identifying monuments that are worthy of preservation, based on the criteria that they are of historic, cultural, traditional, archaeological, architectural, artistic or symbolic significance and national importance.
