



How can I best assist my students during a self-guided visit?

- Make a preparatory visit to familiarise yourself with the gallery space and alighting points
- Draw links between the artefacts and artworks to teaching curriculum
- Identify key theme(s) and specific information that you wish to share
- Use available educator's resources at each Museum and Heritage Institution website, Roots.sg and at www.nhb.gov.sg/education
- When visiting, allow time for students to quietly observe the artefacts. Encourage them to analyse their observations and what it makes them feel or think about
- Conduct follow-up lessons in class to address what they have learnt





Museum Etiquette

Please inform your students to observe the following etiquette so as to provide the best experience for all at the museums. A short video on museum etiquette is also available for viewing at http://www.nhb.gov.sg/education/resources-for-families

What is considered proper conduct in the museums?

- Be considerate to others by keeping voices low
- Do not lean on glass panels or use them to write on, as this may break the glass, tip the showcase or cause damage to the artefacts
- Use pencils and not pens when writing notes, as they may cause permanent marks or stains
- Help us preserve artefacts by not touching them, unless otherwise stated
- Eating or drinking in the galleries is strictly not permitted
- Flash photography is not allowed inside the galleries, as this might harm vulnerable materials such as paper due to accumulated exposure to strong lighting. Flash lights, for instance, can also cause coloured pigments to fade Note: Copyright issues may apply even when photography is allowed in specific galleries

How can I maximise the benefits of a museum visit?

- Keep your voice low and listen attentively to the guide or docent
- Make close observations on the artefacts, paintings or works of art
- Try and think about how these artefacts relate to what you have learnt before
- Be inquisitive! Ask questions on any aspect of the exhibition or artefacts you wish to know about
- Don't be afraid to try the hands-on activities available

For students, do remember to conduct yourselves properly when walking individually or in groups within the galleries. Please discuss quietly even as you work together on your assignments. The museum is a space for observing, thinking and quiet learning, and we hope to maintain and provide the best experience for all. See you at the museums!
