
SOCIAL STORY: Visiting the Asian Civilisations Museum

When I see this building, I will know that I am at the museum. This building is more than 150 years old! Before it became a museum, many government offices were in the building.

I might meet people who work in the museum. They will tell me more about what to do when I am visiting so I can enjoy my time at the museum.






I may meet security guards. They keep us safe in the museum and protect the objects on display.





I may see groups of visitors on guided tours. These tours are led by people called "docents". They volunteer their time to help at the museum. Docents love to share what they know about the museum.








There are many different rooms called "galleries" in the museum. I might not get to visit all of them on one trip, but I can come again another time.








I will see red stickers on the floor in the galleries. These stickers remind us stay 1-metre apart, for good safe distancing.



Some galleries are big and open. I might feel nervous, but I can take deep breaths to calm myself down.





My teacher will stay with me and I will still have fun at the museum!






At the end of our trip, my classmates and I will follow our teachers and walk out of the museum through the lobby.
