


Welcome to the ACM studio!

Ashley Isham

As a child, Ashley would watch and help his seamstress mother with her sewing. One of Singapore's most prominent designers, Ashley combines feminine and well-draped cuts in his designs.

Max challenges fashion trends and traditions with his innovative and unexpected designs. He explores his Asian heritage through tailoring and draping, and by playing with volume and shape.



Jon Max Goh

The winner of Singapore Stories 2021, Jon was inspired by the ACM collection. He explores the themes of technology and Singapore identity with his use of soft textures and fluid fabrics.



Shawna Wu

Known for her butterfly knots and hand-weaving techniques, Shawna uses sustainable and upcycled materials in her garments that speak of tradition and intimacy.

Inspiration can be found all around us.


Let's take a look at what inspires our designers.

This ensemble was inspired by designer Harry Halim's personal emotions of love, attraction, and desire. It conveys self-expression with no judgement.








First destination: The Studio






Use these shapes to help kickstart your own designs. You can combine them to create new shapes too!

Second destination: Accessories


Let's accessorise your outfit!

Distortion


A change from natural or usual shape.


Experimental

New and innovative style.


Silhouette

A garment's overall shape or outline.




