ACM opens new gallery of Chinese Ceramics with over 300 objects on display



Singapore, **6 May 2016** - The Asian Civilisations Museum (ACM) collection of Chinese ceramics spans the entire history of production in China, from the Neolithic agricultural revolution 10,000 years ago, to the twilight of the last imperial dynasty, the Qing. In the gallery, we have carefully assembled groups of artworks that tell specific stories about Chinese ceramics from within this broad tradition. Of special note, ACM now displays a large selection of delightful figures and other forms from its extensive collection of Dehua porcelain.

- 2. A broad survey of ACM's collection of Chinese ceramics is now on display in a newly revamped gallery. The display spans 333 sq metres, an area that includes Level 3 of the museum's new Kwek Hong Png Wing. Interpretive materials explore how ceramics were made, used, and valued throughout Chinese history.
- 3. Mr Kwek Leng Beng, Governor of Hong Leong Foundation, said "ACM has a strong collection of Dehua porcelain; it is one of the finest and most

comprehensive in the world. We are very proud to help in the effort to build new spaces to display such stunning masterpieces that will be exhibited for all to appreciate. The new gallery also gives access to the public to tap on the museum as a source of knowledge."

- The opening of this gallery for Chinese Ceramics is also an important milestone for both ACM and Hong Leong Foundation, as it marks the completion of the Kwek Hong Png wing at the ACM. "Once again, we congratulate ACM on the launch of its new spaces which are examples of juxtaposed architecture of the highest degree. As the museum's longest donor, we are pleased to be part of this momentous journey."
- Dr Alan Chong, director of the Asian Civilisations Museum, says: "The museum's new ceramics gallery is installed in the third floor of the Kwek Hong Png Wing. Filled with natural light and given a clean contemporary design, the galleries present a survey of Chinese ceramics. Particular attention is drawn to highlights from the Song and Liao periods and the Transitional Period. Most of all, the new gallery focus on the marvellous white porcelain produced in Dehua, in Fujian province. We are proud to show one of the largest and finest collections of Dehua porcelain."
