

Dennis' Naughty Prank

An artefact hunt based on the Opposites Early Learning Resources (ELR) booklet



Hello parents and educators,

In this hunt, explore the museum with your children to find 6 artefacts that are featured in the Opposites Early Learning Resources (ELR) booklet.

Use the clues to look for the artefacts and spend some time talking and learning more about them as you go along. Have fun!

This activity is estimated to take up to 1 hour with discussion questions included.



Tips to maximise the hunt activity experience

- Print out this booklet and bring it along with you to the galleries or download it to your mobile device for easy reference during the hunt.
- Read out the story and questions on the following pages to engage children in conversations.
- Encourage children to take charge of searching for the answers in the ELR booklet using the clues provided in the hunt.
- If feasible, bring cameras for children to take photos of the artefacts (without flash), so that they can be used for reflection time at home or a show-and-tell activity in school after the hunt.
- Encourage children to reflect on their experience with some question prompts below:
- a. When did you go to the museum?
- b. What was your favourite artefact at the museum?
- c. Why do you like this artefact?
- d. What did you learn about this artefact?
- e. Who would you like to visit the museum with?
- Encourage children to look for objects at home or in school that are similar or related to the artefacts and to share their similarities and differences.

Artefact Hunt: Dennis' Naughty Prank

One day after school, Dennis sits alone in his room and complains, "I am so bored. Everyone is busy and there is no one to play with me!"

He takes a ball and begins to throw it around the house. Suddenly, he hears a loud CRASH and sees that the ball has knocked over Papa Sunbear's favourite vase!

"Oh no!" cries Dennis as he stares at the **broken** pieces on the floor.

What do you think Dennis saw?


Look at the word in bold! Which artefact in the Opposites ELR booklet fits the description?

The gallery is quite big as it covers 700 years of Singapore history. Flip to the map of the Singapore History Gallery (in purple) in the Opposites booklet for the location of the artefact!





- · How many broken pieces are there in this display?
- · What colours and patterns can you see on them?
- Have you broken a glass object before? What happened?
- Do you think that the broken pieces can be put back together?





"Papa will be upset if he finds out that I broke his favourite porcelain vase from China!" Dennis sighs.

"Maybe I can tell him that a robber came to steal Mama's precious **silver bowl** and broke the vase when I chased him away!"

She runs out of the house and uses an object to **make a loud sound** to alert their neighbours about the robbery.

What did Mama Binturong hit to make the loud sound?

Take a close look at this artefact in front of you.

- · What sound do you think it will make?

Next, Mama Binturong calls Papa Sunbear, who is a policeman, and tells him about what happened.

Papa immediately rushes over to investigate the robbery.

As he stomps into the house, Papa Sunbear waves a **short stick**, in case the robber is nearby.

What is Papa Sunbear carrying in his hand?

Once you have the answers, let us head to the Growing Up gallery on level 2 to look for the artefacts!




Flip to the map of the Growing Up gallery (in yellow) in the Opposites booklet for the location of the artefacts!
