What is this kit about?

Developed together with Wigglepods Pte Ltd, this kit contains five activities based on the 123 Early Learning Resource booklet 3 , for parents to:

- Help your child relate to, better understand, and talk about local artefacts in the museum's collection, while learning more about letters in the alphabet
- Carry out guided music and movement activities with your child at home, and be inspired to come up with more activity ideas
- Have lots of fun with your child!

Children will get to practise language and numeracy skills such as singing, counting and diversity in language. With many of the activities incorporating elements of music and movement, children can also hone their motor skills, body awareness, concentration and creativity.

How do I use this kit?

For each activity, a recommended age group is stated and key early learning concepts such as "visual tracking" are explained. You may choose to go through selected activities or all of them.

The activities include

- Templates or worksheets that can be printed out and worked on together
- Video and audio clips that the whole family can sing and dance along to!

We recommend that you go through this kit while connected to reliable Wi-Fi at home. Have fun!

- Enhance confidence, social skills and sense of achievement



- Develop visual memory and observation skills



Memory Game



How to play:

- 1. Print two sets of the ten cards found on pages 8 and 9.
- 2. Cut along the dotted lines of the cards.
- 3. Mix all the cards.
- 4. Lay the cards on a surface with the pictures facing down.
- 5. Flip over two cards at a time to try and find a match (i.e. with both cards showing the same image).
- 6. If you find a match, you can put the cards aside.
- 7. If the cards are not a match (i.e. both cards show different images), turn them back with the pictures facing down.
- 8. The game is over once all the cards have been matched.







- Cognitive skills: Problem solving, concentration, Eyehand coordination


A Note for Parents

Visual tracking:

- Helps control eye movements
- Improves attention skills
- Promotes midline crossing
- Develops visual fixation (maintaining a steady gaze on a target) ability


