

Be A Creative Toymaker: Rocking Horse

Horse-shaped baby rocking chairs were commonly found in households in Singapore in the 1960s. Has anyone in your family ever owned one, or do you have any similar toys today?



Instructions:

- 1. Colour in your rocking horse.
- **2.** Cut out the rocking horse along the dotted lines.

(Tip: To create a sturdier structure, stick the template onto a thicker piece of paper or cardboard, such as from a recycled cereal box, before cutting out your rocking horse.)

- 3. Fold along the bold line to make your rocking horse stand, as shown in the image on the left.*
- 4. Your rocking horse is now ready!
