
### Getting to *Reunion* via Stamford Road (sheltered, some stairs)

Option 1: via main museum entrance
Enter the museum from the main entrance
and rotunda.



In the rotunda, walk towards the left of the stairs at the back of the rotunda, and walk through the arched entryway.







#### Option 1: via main museum entrance

Keep walking straight towards the Singapore History Gallery.

You will pass the Visitor Service Counter, and a digital mural on your left.

Walk past the mural through to the museum's main atrium.







#### Option 1: via main museum entrance

Once you have arrived at museum's entrance, head towards the Singapore History Gallery on level 1.

Once you are facing the Singapore History Gallery, make a left turn and walk down the concourse past Museum Market by ABRY.

After passing the Museum Market, continue walking through Dame's alfresco dining area towards the end of the concourse.

Just before the automated glass doors, there is another set of doors to the left. Turn towards these doors.



Once facing the right, walk straight ahead.










You will walk past a blue direction signage.

Once past the blue direction signage, make two left turns to head in the direction of the museum side entrance.

Head in the direction of the rotunda, towards the side entrance of the museum.

You will pass by a water fountain on your left.

Walk straight towards the automated glass doors and press the button to enter the museum.






Once past the automated glassdoors, turn to the right.

Keep walking straight towards the Singapore History Gallery.

You will pass the Visitor Service Counter, and a digital mural on your left.






## Getting to Reunion From Stamford Road

### Where is *Reunion* Social Space and Café? Entrance Option Along Stamford Road (next to SMU Campus)







### Getting to Reunion via Stamford Road

(unsheltered, stairs)

Option 3a: via front entrance of Reunion

This is one of the entrances to *Reunion*, facing Stamford road.

From the SMU Campus, walk towards the Fort Canning Park sign.

Climb up the stairs or use the wheelchair-friendly path to get to the stone path.

Walk straight along the stone path.





### Option 3a: via front entrance of Reunion

You will come to an intersection along the stone path. Turn right to face the museum building.

Walk straight along the path.





### Getting to *Reunion* via Stamford Road

(unsheltered, stairs)

#### Option 3a: via front entrance of Reunion

You will see signage for Reunion and Café Brera.

Walk up the stairs to enter Reunion's main entrance through the doors.

This entrance is open from 9am – 6pm daily.

Through the doors you will find the main entry cove to Reunion.





## Getting to *Reunion* via Stamford Road (unsheltered, accessible)

#### Option 3b: via accessible entrance of Reunion

For the accessible wheelchair-friendly entrance, turn left once you reach the intersection.

Walk along the side of the building and turn right at the corner.






### Getting to *Reunion* via Stamford Road (unsheltered, accessible)

#### Option 3b: via accessible entrance of Reunion

Once you head around the building, walk straight in the direction of the museum automated glass doors.

The wheelchair accessible ramp is along this direction. Enter Reunion via the ramp.

# Getting to Reunion From Canning Rise Entrance (Coach Bay) (accessible route)



### Option 4: via main museum (accessible route)

This is the Level 2 museum entrance and pick up/drop off point for coaches, which can be accessed via Canning Rise.

This entrance is open from 9am to 7pm daily.



### Option 4: via main museum (accessible route)

Enter the museum from the museum's L2 entrance via 40 Canning Rise, Singapore 179870 (level 2) and head down to **Level 1** via the fireman lift.





Option 4: via main museum (accessible route)


Continue walking straight to the end of the hallway

At the end of the hallway, turn to the right to access the fireman lift.






### Option 3: via museum stairs entrance






# Getting to Reunion via Canning Rise (unsheltered, stairs)

#### Option 5: via museum stairs entrance

This is the entrance **via stairs** to the museum, that is the nearest from the Fort Canning Car Park A, facing Canning Rise.

This entrance is open from 9am (Mon-Fri)/ 9.30am (Sat/Sun) to 7pm daily.




# Getting to Reunion via Canning Rise (unsheltered, stairs)

### Option 5: via museum stairs entrance

Entering from the stairs entrance will bring you to **level 3** of the museum. Turn left to take the lift straight down to **Level 1** or take the stairs down to **level 2**.

At **Level 2**, you can proceed to take the escalator down to **level 1**.







#### **Option 5: via museum stairs entrance**

Follow the sticker signs on the floor to the lift. Open the door at the end of the hallway to access the lift.

Take the lift down to level 1.






### Option 5: via museum stairs entrance



#### 1. Memory Lane

Enter Memory Lane to view virtual exhibitions designed by past participants.

You may also stand in front of the screen to take a picture with your favourite design, or relax on the banquette seats or armchair while viewing the exhibition artworks.

#### 2. Music Booths

You are welcome to take a seat at one of the two (2) music booths and select familiar or favourite tunes from the past on the iPad.

If you are unable to find a song on the iPad, let us know by filling in the "Song Suggestion" physical form and drop it into the pink "Song Suggestion" box, or use the digital form by scanning the QR code on the box.

Feel free to pick up any of the handling objects in the shelves and be inspired to share your stories and memories about them with others in the booth. Remember to place them back after use.







#### 3. Activity Area

You are welcome to take a seat at the Activity Area and enjoy conversations with your friends.

Food and drinks from the café are allowed in the Activity Area when there are no programmes. Do check out our Social Etiquette list at the entrances of the space.

There are handling objects and conversation starter guides featuring our National Collection that are located around the *Reunion* space. Feel free to pick them up for use, and engage in reminiscence conversations with others.
