Where is *Reunion* Social Space and Café?

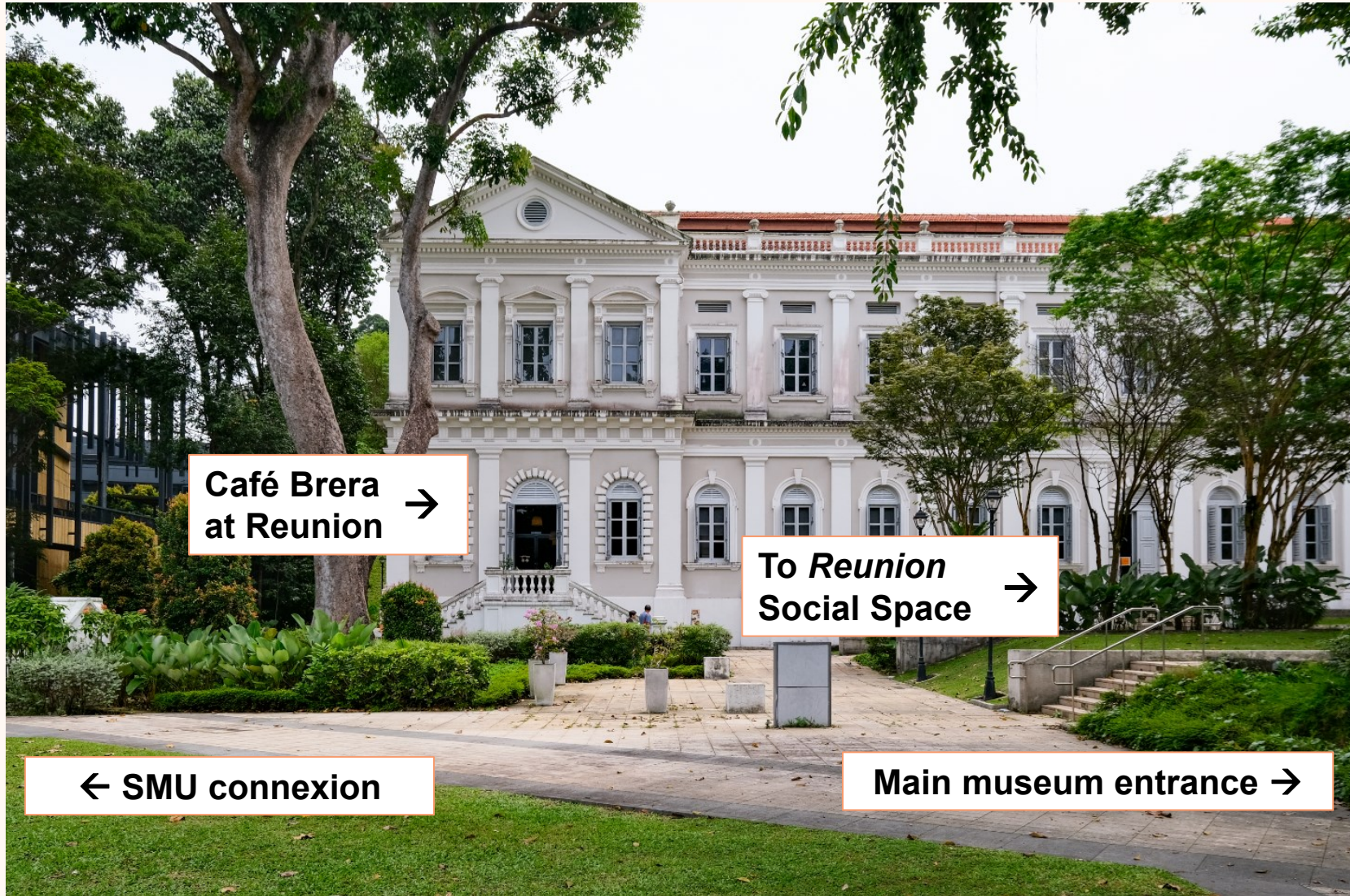

Getting to *Reunion*

Option 1 (via stairs):

This is one of the entrances **via stairs** to *Reunion*, facing Stamford Road.

This entrance is open from 9am to 6pm daily.

Getting to *Reunion*

Option 2 (via outdoor ramp)

This is one of the two wheelchair-friendly entrances to *Reunion*. It is accessible via the side entrance facing Fort Canning and it opens from 9am to 6pm daily.



To get to the ramp, follow this path on the left of the main entrance of Café Brera at Reunion.

Make a right turn at the end of this path to get to the side entrance.



Getting to *Reunion*

Option 3 (via sheltered ramp)

This is the alternative sheltered wheelchair-friendly entrance to *Reunion*, through the museum's main space.



Please approach one of our friendly Security Officers (they are dressed in a white shirt with black tie and/or a coat) if you need directions to the sheltered wheelchair-accessible drop-off area upon arrival at the museum.



Getting to *Reunion*

Option 3 (via sheltered ramp)

Once you have arrived at museum's entrance, head towards the Singapore History Gallery on level 1.



At the Singapore History Gallery, make a left turn and walk down the concourse towards Food For Thought.



Getting to *Reunion*

Option 3 (via sheltered ramp)

You are welcome to walk through Food For Thought's dining space (the waiters are understanding 😊) and head towards the door at the end of the concourse. Turn left and enter through this door.



Head right and look out for this directional sign. Follow the path through this corridor.





Getting to *Reunion*

Option 3 (via sheltered ramp)

Follow this path.

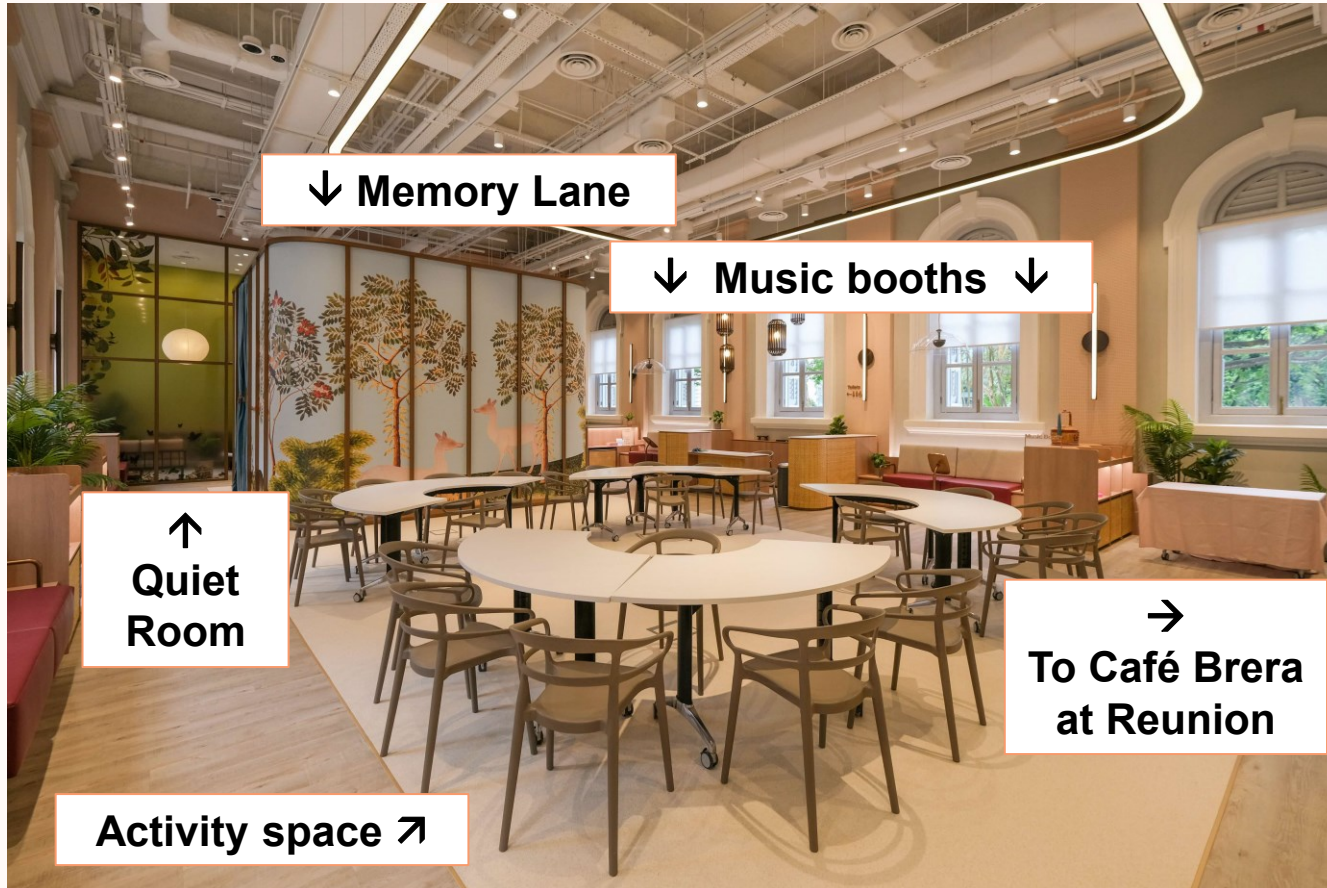
There are directional signs above to assist you, if required.



Keep walking straight and you'll arrive at the Reunion Entrance Cove entrance.

Facilities / Features in Reunion

There are five (5) key areas in *Reunion*:

1. Memory Lane
2. Music Booths
3. Activity Area
4. Quiet Room
5. Café Brera at Reunion



1. Memory Lane

Enter Memory Lane to view virtual exhibitions designed by past participants.

You may also stand in front of the screen to take a picture with your favourite design, or relax on the banquette seats or armchair while viewing the exhibition artworks.

Please be careful not to touch the screen as it is very fragile.

2. Music Booths

You are welcome to take a seat at one of the two (2) music booths and select familiar or favourite tunes from the past on the iPad.

If you are unable to find a song on the iPad, let us know by filling in the “Song Suggestion” physical form and drop it into the pink “Song Suggestion” box, or use the digital form by scanning the QR code on the box.

Feel free to pick up any of the handling objects in the shelves and be inspired to share your stories and memories about them with others in the booth. Remember to put them back after use.

3. Activity Area

You are welcome to take a seat at the Activity Area and enjoy conversations with your friends.

No food and drinks are allowed in this space to keep the space clean. Do check out our Social Etiquette list at the entrances of the space.

There are handling objects and conversation starter guides featuring our National Collection that are located around the *Reunion* space. Feel free to pick them up for use, and engage in reminiscence conversations with others.





4. Quiet Room

This is the Quiet Room that is designed for any visitors who may require a calming environment to rest in, before resuming their activity in *Reunion*.

Only one (1) pair of visitor and his/her caregiver is allowed to use the room at any time.



Features in the Quiet Room

Cushions in the cubicles and footrest under the sofa can be used for better support while sitting on the sofa.

There are roller blinds in this room to create a comfortable space for seniors to recalibrate themselves.

There is also a fidget blanket and museum resources for visitors to engage with, to take a break from the activities outside.



5. Café Brera at Reunion

The café is located adjacent to the *Reunion* social space via the connecting door.

Round up your visit with some fresh bakes and wholesome food suitable for seniors at the café, over hearty conversations.

The café also serves up dysphagia-friendly food, which are suitable for people with swallowing difficulties.
