This exhibition explores the extraordinary sculptures of the Batak peoples of northern Sumatra. The Batak live in the mountain heartlands centred around Lake Toba, a striking environment that nurtured an intriguing culture rooted in ancient Southeast Asian traditions. The show asserts a rightful place for Batak sculpture in the global artistic canon. The Mandala Foundation has lent over 80 works in wood, stone and bronze. Of these 80, 20 pieces have been donated to the Asian Civilisations Museum.

Vastly superior to the ceramics made in other regions, Chinese porcelain of various sizes and colours were eagerly sought after – and just as eagerly copied and imitated. This exhibition examines the global demand for porcelain, not only in Europe and America, but also within Asia, for example, Japan, Southeast Asia, and the Islamic world.

Through 150 objects, including new acquisitions, *China Mania!* examines how international trade and cultural exchange spread styles, forms, and manufacturing technologies throughout different regions. These exchanges dramatically altered the course of Asian art. The ceramics became prized heirlooms valued for their exotic origins, superior technology, and beauty.

Daily Life in Myanmar's Ancient Cities Speaker: Bob Hudson

Three huge brick-walled cities in Myanmar are currently going through the UNESCO World Heritage nomination process. They date to around AD 150, many centuries earlier than the Myanmar capital, Bagan. Many fascinating finds have been unearthed during excavations at the sites.

This presentation builds a picture of those long-lost societies through the material goods they left behind. Objects from Brahman and Buddhist agriculturalists and traders wary of intruders from the spirit world and the treasures enshrined in Buddhist monuments tell us much about daily lives and religious aspirations. Modernday treasure hunters, who until recently panned illegally for gold in what are now ricefields, and dug for beads in ancient cemeteries, will also be discussed. That they were still finding valuable items in the 21st century is further proof of the wealth and creativity of the ancient inhabitants.

The National Museum of Singapore is proud to present *Genesis*, an exhibition showcasing 245 black and white images of our planet by world renowned photographer, Sebastião Salgado, designed and curated by Lélia Wanick Salgado. This exhibition is a culmination of Salgado's photographic works taken at over 30 different destinations from 2004 to 2011. Dramatic, moving and grand, Salgado's photographs present powerful images of our fragile planet and the intricate association between Man, animal and the environment that we all have a duty to protect. The exhibition is presented through five geographic sections: the South of the Planet, Natural Sanctuaries, Africa, the North of the Planet, Amazonia and the Pantanal in Brazil's Mato Grosso. Visitors will journey to beautifully rugged landscapes, seascapes and gain insight into the extraordinary wildlife and tribes found in the far corners of the world.

Genesis is set to follow in the lines of previous photography exhibitions held at the National Museum of Singapore, including *Doubleness: Photography of Chang Chien-Chi* (2009) and *Abbas: 45 Years of Photography* (2011), that continues to reflect the museum's vision of presenting history and culture through the medium of photography.

Auspicious Designs: Batik for Peranakan Altars

Colourful and imaginative, batik altar cloths blend traditions and influences, showing how Peranakans adapted and improvised. Called *tok wi*, altar cloths decorate the fronts of Peranakan altars during important ceremonies, and reflect the strong ritual elements of Chinese Peranakan life in Southeast Asia.

This exhibition focuses on a group of batik altar cloths generously donated to the Peranakan Museum by Matthew and Alice Yapp. Families traditionally used embroidered cloths made in southern China. but in the early 20th century, some began using cloths made of local batik. Produced on the north coast of Java, the batik altar cloths in this exhibition feature traditional Chinese symbols as well as designs from Europe and Southeast Asia. A catalogue of the museum's collection accompanies the exhibition.


